Making fold mountains

Learn about mountain formation and create your own fold mountains from cardboard, towels, or even biscuits!

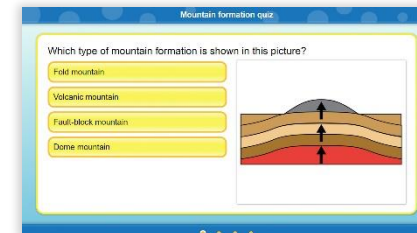
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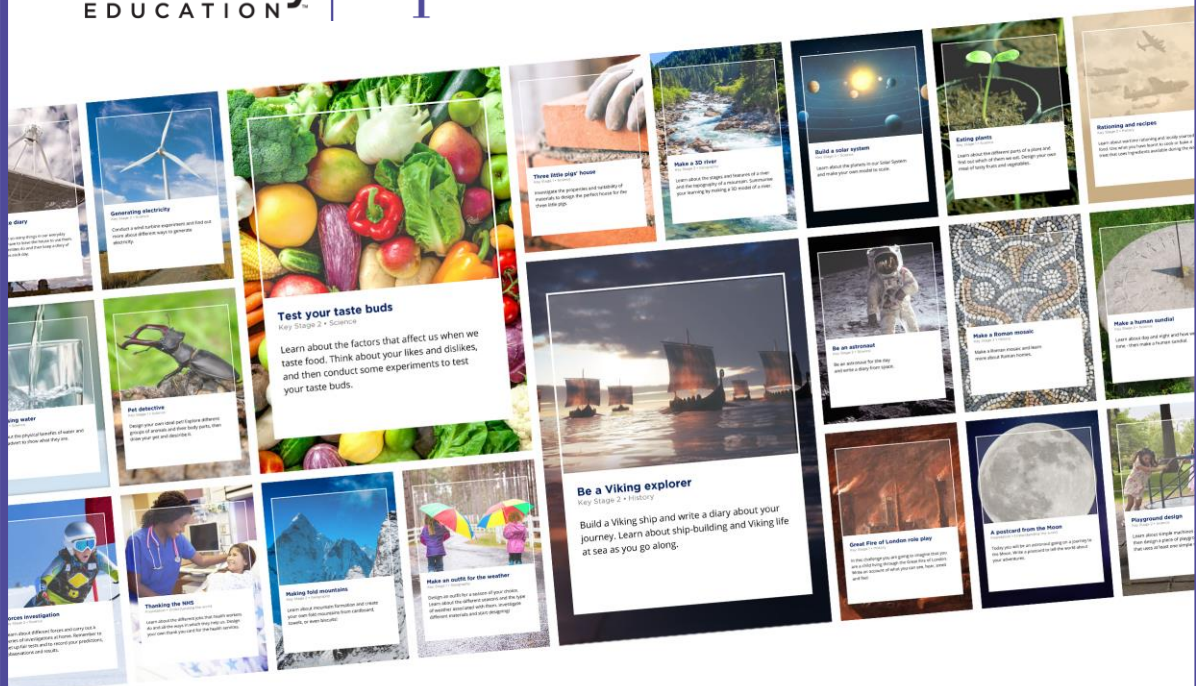


Preview of pupil steps:

1. Create your own fold mountains!
First, let's investigate how they're formed.
2. Watch this video on how mountains are formed. What are the different types of mountain? Why do mountains change over time?
3. Read about how different types of mountain are formed. Why do we often get mountain ranges rather than single free-standing mountains?
4. Test your knowledge of different types of mountain formation.
5. Investigate these two different ways of creating fold mountains. Why not take a photo and label what each aspect represents. You could add arrows to show the movement of the plates. How could you show the formation of a dome mountain using a balloon?

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How to load a lesson:
